PE Kit (Children will wear PE kits to school on PE days) Navy blue tracksuit (plain with no branding) - optional Navy blue shorts* or skort



Hair – back out of face Jewellery - Removed for PE - Earrings - taped up

* Shoes— black school shoes – not boots or trainers.

- For health and safety reasons and no open-toed sandals.

- * Bags—
- * Jewellery—No jewellery except watches. If pupils have pierced ears they may wear small discreet studs.
- * Make up No make up and nail varnish
- * Hair—Long hair should be tied back. Hair ornaments should be discreet and be in school colours.

Characteristics of Effective Learning

The Characteristics of Effective Learning are essential aspects that we focus on during the children's time with us. These are embodied in 3 main areas:

Playing and Exploring
Active Learning
Creating and Thinking Critically

What does my child need to bring to school daily?

* **Drop off from 08.35** as the gate to the Reception classroom will be open

* Register at 08.45

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If you arrive after this time please report to the office

* Finish at 15.15 and the children should be collected at the Reception class gate

Morning routine

We encourage the children to independently do as much as possible in the morning:

- * Hang up coats on their peg
- * Water bottle in the trays on top of the blue trolley
- * Lunch/fruit boxes on the shelves of the trolley
- * Book bags go in the tray
- * Self register
- * Voting station
- * Choose game/activity on the carpet/morning activity

A daily timetable may be:



- Independent learning time indoors and outdoor area and follow their interests/school topic
- During this time the adults will do some adult lead activities in groups as short follow up activities for Phonics, Maths and Literacy.
- Snack at 10.30am and 2.30pm.
- Lunch will be at midday dietary requirements

Home time

- * Pick up Reception class gate
- * Short messages of their day
- * Someone else picking up?

Starting the School Year

 Smooth transition into Reception -half days in the morning for the first week 8.35 – 12.00

* Monday 4th September – Friday 8th September

* The children will have lunch in school on these days

* Full days at school start from Monday 11th September.

Home Visits

- * Home visits are a great way to continue to develop a relationship between us, your child and yourself.
- * Information can be shared
- * Home visits will take place in the afternoons of the first week of school (4th-8th September)
- * They will last 30 minutes each.
- * You will receive the date and time of your Home visit by email from the school before the end of term.

Things you can help your child develop before they start school

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- * Dressing and undressing as independently as possible
- * Putting on coats and hanging them up
- Putting their things away bags, shoes etc.
- * Tidying up toys and in the right places
- Using the toilet independently and wiping themselves independently
- * Flushing toilets, washing hands and folding paper to wipe
- Opening and closing water bottles, food packets, oranges etc.
- * Confidently saying goodbye to carer
- * Using knife and fork and begin to cut their food
- * Lids on pens

Things you can help your child develop before they start school

Communication and Literacy

- Recognising and beginning to write their own name
- * Reading and enjoying stories and nursery rhymes with adults
- Singing familiar songs
- * Sharing lots of talk and conversations

Maths

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- * Counting as much as possible
- Singing maths songs
- Recognising, talking about numbers
- * Problem solving know where to find things

- If something isn't there where will you look? No water bottle what should I do? If they lost a jumper – look for the name.

- * All About Me booklets
- * Parent questionnaires
- * Please do label all your child's belongings
- * Piece of fruit and a water bottle daily.
- * Inhalers
- * Medication
- * Spare set of clothes in named bag
- * Birthday
